ROTC

Cadets are required to participate in one of the four (Army, Marines, Navy, or Air Force) ROTC programs during their cadet-ship. Roughly 50 percent of graduates choose to commission upon graduation, though it is not required.

HONOR AND SERVICE

VMI cadets are men and women of honor and integrity who can always be trusted. They live by a simple code, The VMI Honor Code, which states that "A cadet will not lie, cheat, steal, nor tolerate those who do."
